AKC FIT DOG



The American Kennel Club is committed to improving and maintaining the fitness and health of all dogs and their owners.

AKC FIT DOG titles were designed to provide a structured, individualized fitness plan that you and your dog can do together.

There are 3 levels of AKC fitness titles-

Bronze (FITB), Silver (FITS), and Gold (FITG). Each title requires a specific number of activity points to be completed, which varies based on title level.

Bronze – 5 Points Silver – 10 Points Gold – 20 Points

Within each level, there are 6 categories of activities to choose from to earn your points.

Detail for each category appear in the Participant Guide.

AKC Fitness Title Categories:

AKC FIT DOG Course

Runs (community runs such as a Turkey Trot, Spring Scurry, etc.)

Walks and hikes (Independent or Group)

Unique to You and Your Dog (e.g., swimming, Parkour)

AKC title that is fitness related (e.g., FAST CAT, agility)

AKC Parent Club Performance Titles (e.g., pack dog, sledding)

For each of the 3 levels of titles, a minimum number of points must be earned in at least 2 categories for the title to be awarded.

AKC FIT DOG titles are noncompetitive, and dog owners may choose different activities to earn titles.

AKC Fetch Event at the club on Saturday and Sunday, September 6 & 7, 2025!


Welcome to AKC Fetch!

When dog owners are asked what they enjoy most with their dogs, the top answers are going for walks and playing fetch. The AKC Fetch program was developed as part of the AKC Family Dog Program to turn this everyday game into a rewarding title opportunity!

Fetch is a fun, non-competitive, pass/fail event designed to provide both mental and physical exercise for dogs of all breeds. Whether your dog is a natural retriever or new to the game, there's a level for everyone!

There are four title levels:

- Novice
- Intermediate
- Advanced
- Retriever



Advanced levels introduce more complex skills, including signal work and memory tasks such as retrieving a ball or bumper from behind a blind.

To earn a title, your dog must pass the test twice under two different approved AKC Fetch judges. Eligibility:

- Dogs must be 6 months or older
- Must be registered or enrolled with the AKC (AKC number, PAL, or Canine Partners)

Help My Pet Got Stung By A Bee

Spring and summer bring longer days, blooming flowers, and, unfortunately, more bees buzzing around our pets. While a curious sniff or playful bat can quickly turn into an unpleasant sting, it's essential to know how to react. This guide covers the steps dog and cat owners should take if their furry friend encounters a bee sting, ensuring quick and effective relief.

Stay Calm and Assess the Situation:

First, stay calm. Your pet will likely be distressed, and your composure can help soothe them. Check the sting site carefully. If the stinger is still present, try to gently scrape it out with a credit card or similar object. Avoid using tweezers, as squeezing could release more venom.

Managing Pain and Swelling:

Apply a cold pack to the affected area to reduce swelling and soothe pain. Make sure to wrap the ice pack in a towel to prevent cold injury to the skin. For dogs, an oatmeal bath can provide additional relief. However, cats may not tolerate this, so consider consulting your vet for alternative soothing options.

Monitor for Allergic Reactions:

Watch your pet closely for signs of an allergic reaction, which can include excessive swelling, difficulty breathing, or unusual lethargy. These symptoms can manifest within 10 to 30 minutes of the sting and require immediate veterinary attention. Remember, even if your pet has been stung before without issue, reactions can worsen with subsequent stings.

When to Visit the Vet:

If you notice any signs of an allergic reaction, or if the sting is located in a sensitive area such as the mouth or throat (which could lead to swelling that obstructs breathing), it's time to visit the vet. Additionally, if your pet seems excessively uncomfortable or the swelling doesn't subside, seek professional advice.

Prevent Future Stings:


Prevention is key to avoiding bee stings. Keep an eye on your pet during outdoor activities, especially in areas with flowering plants or exposed garbage cans that attract bees. Training your dog to come when called can quickly remove them from a potential sting situation, while keeping cats indoors or supervised outdoors can limit their exposure.


